TYPES OF APPRENTICESHIPS

There are two apprenticeship programmes funded by the Department for the Economy (DfE):

- ApprenticeshipsNI Level 2 and 3 available to individuals 16 and over, however certain conditions apply to individuals aged 25 and over in certain occupational areas
- Higher Level Apprenticeships (HLAs) Level 4 to Level 7 HLAs are not subject to age eligibility restrictions

With ApprenticeshipsNI you can either progress from Level 2 to Level 3 or go straight to Level 3, depending on your ability and the qualifications you already have. It usually takes between two and four years to complete.

An Apprentice is in paid employment from day one and follows a national training framework which leads to the attainment of industry approved competence and knowledge based qualifications, at Level 2 or 3, in conjunction with Essential Skills qualifications (where appropriate).

HLAs offer frameworks from Level 4 upwards and will take a minimum of two

years to complete. Apprenticeship levels are equivalent to:

Level 2 (5 GCSEs)

- ► Level 3 (2 A Levels)
- ► Levels 4 and 5 (Foundation degree)
- ► Levels 6 and above (Bachelor or Master's degree)
